COLLEGE PRESENTATION (BENCHMARKS 1, 2 & 7)

This presentation aims to inspire students to consider studying post-16 with an insight into student life and what to expect from the Sixth Form College. The messages can be tailored to school needs. These can be delivered as an assembly to a whole year group; in a classroom setting or to parents.


